Application Checklist

- Complete the online application for admission (www.methodistCOL.edu/apply)
- Pay the non-refundable application fee (www.methodistCOL.edu/apply)
- Submit transcripts (or proof of GED) from all high schools attended
 - Students with an earned Associate's Degree (or higher) do not need to submit a high school transcript
 - Students with over 30 earned college credits can submit unofficial high school/GED transcripts
 - Students with less than 30 earned college credits MUST submit official high school/GED transcripts
- Submit OFFICIAL transcripts from all colleges attended

- If you're an applicant with less than 30 college credits earned, you must submit an OFFICIAL copy of your ACT or SAT scores
 - Many high schools print this on your transcript, but not all. Call your high school to find out!

➤ **After submitting your application, you will be e-mailed a username and password for your CAMS student portal, where you can check the status of your transcripts and admissions decision, obtain a transfer credit report, and view financial aid information.**

- Once all official documents are received, an admissions decision will be made in 7-14 business days.
- If more information is needed, the Director of Admissions will contact you by phone and/or e-mail using the contact information specified on your application.
- Don't forget to fill out your FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov and have it sent to Methodist College (school code: 006228)

- ✓ 2.0 cumulative college GPA
- ✓ 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) high school GPA**
- ✓ Composite ACT score of 19 or an SAT score of 980**
