#### **Admission Process:**

- Apply and submit application fee at www.MethodistCol.edu/apply
- Submit all official transcripts\*
- Submit official SAT score (school code 1503) or ACT score (school code 1078). Not required for students who have earned 30 or more college credits
- Proof of graduation from state-approved high school (diploma or GED certificate). Not required for students who have earned a college degree (associate or higher)

Methodist College offers two degree programs for individuals interested in careers as leaders or managers in healthcare organizations: the Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Management and the Bachelor of Science in Health Science | Health Sciences. Students who graduate from these programs are equipped with the knowledge and skills to manage the day-to-day operations of various healthcare organizations, including ambulatory clinics, wellness centers, medical practices, government agencies, or nonprofit organizations. Leaders in these organizations can engage in the supervision of personnel, strategic planning and departmental organization.

## **MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:**

- 2.0 cumulative college GPA
- 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) high school GPA\*
- Composite ACT score of 19 or an SAT score of 980\*
  - \* Only required for students with less than 30 college credits.

## STUDENT HOUSING

The Prairie Sky Apartments at Methodist College provide student housing convenient to the campus. Located directly behind the college, the furnished apartments offer students a community to make new friends and get support from other students who are focused on the same goals.

# BS | **HEALTHCARE MANAGEMENT**

The Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Management prepares students to be leaders in healthcare organizations. The Healthcare Management degree is ideal for students just beginning their baccalaureate degree, for students who want to transfer general education credits, or for students transferring completed associate degrees in arts or in sciences. The Healthcare Management program offers an internship that provides the student an opportunity to integrate and apply their knowledge and skills in a dynamic organization. Internships are hosted by healthcare and human services organizations. We are able to design internship experiences that accommodate students who work part-time or full-time. In some cases, unique internship experiences can be designed at the organization where the student works. The interns will become part of daily operations and assist with the administration of projects and resources under the direction of a supervisor.

## BSHS | **HEALTH SCIENCES**

The Bachelor of Science in Health Science with a major in Health Sciences is a degree program for graduates of allied health associate degree programs who want to assume leadership roles within healthcare organizations, or pursue graduate studies. This degree is especially attractive to professionals already working in healthcare related professions such as nutrition, physical therapy, occupational therapy, dental care, radiography, and much more. Up to 30 credits earned in an Associate in Applied Science degree related to health care or human services will be accepted (credits are evaluated by the Methodist College Registrar).

Methodist College offers the BSHS program in several formats to meet the needs of adult learners, including online and hybrid options, that could be delivered using video conferences to create a dynamic learning environment that students can experience from their home or office. The BSHS degree program provides a curriculum in areas of general leadership and in healthcare topics such as informatics in healthcare, healthcare management, and financial management. The final semester of the program includes an internship at a healthcare or human services organization, that can be designed to fit in a student's work schedule, and in some cases, at the organization where the student works.
